

# **Camping**

# Camper Space \$75.00 per assigned space

- 1. Camper space is limited to Vendors and Livestock Exhibitors.
- Horse/Livestock trailers with sleeping quarters will be charged as a camper.
- 3. Fee must be paid in advance with Vendor Contract or Livestock Entries.
- 4. You will receive a Camping Tag with a number, that must be visibly displayed.
- 5. Each exhibitor staying in campers must have a weekly pass that must be worn at all times on fairgrounds. Weekly passes are \$40.00, that include a \$10.00 restocking fee that will be refunded if the pass/lanyard is returned. Your camping fee is a separate fee.
- 6. 4-wheelers, side-by-sides and golf carts are not permitted.
- 7. Absolutely no campfires, open flames or fireworks.
- 8. Alcoholic beverages, illegal substances or firearms are prohibited on the premises.
- 9. No dogs or pets permitted on premises, unless trained service dogs.
- 10. Camp spaces are to be kept clean of trash and garbage at all times.
- Trash and garbage are to be taken to the dumpster by the camper's occupants.
- 12. Kostella & Sons Sanitation is available upon request for cleaning at owners cost. You may reach them at 724-465-5125.
- 13. Quiet Time 11:00pm: Please be considerate of your fellow campers and our neighbors.

# **Concessions and Privileges**

- Insurance: Each vendor must provide a current, and properly signed certificate
  of insurance. Naming the Ox Hill Community Fair as an additional insured.
  General Liability Insurance \$1,000,000
  Commercial Auto Liability Insurance OR
  Proof of personal Auto Insurance Policy (copy of your insurance card)
  Workers' Compensation Insurance
- Terms & Conditions: The Renter or Lessor shall pay and provide the abovementioned Liability Insurance. A certificate of insurance naming the Ox Hill Community Fair as an additional insured must accompany payment.
- 3. Vendors must provide a current copy of their ServSafe Certificate with Payment.
- 4. Concessions are bound by the terms of the contract they sign at the time of securing concessions. They are subject to the supervision of the Concession Managers. The right is reserved to enforce whatever rules appear necessary for the regulation of the Concessions.

# Concessions and Privileges (cont'd.)

- 5. The abuse of any privilege granted by extortion, impure or unwholesome food, sale of dishonest goods, untidy appearance of booths, extension of bounds allotted or other acts or practices objectionable to the Ox Hill Community Fair Association will forfeit all rights and privileges without recourse.
- 6. All booths, stands and tents serving or dispensing foods, drinks, confections, etc. will be under supervision of the State Health Department.
- 7. The sale of alcoholic beverages is prohibited. Under current PA and Federal laws, it is unlawful for anyone to sell consumable/edible CBD products. Such products would include any food, nutritional or dietary supplements, gummies, candy, chewing gum or beverages consumed by humans that contain CBD.
- 8. Vendor recognizes and agrees that Ox Hill Community Fair does not guarantee exclusivity. There may be other vendors at the Fair who are selling similar or the same items.
- 9. Vendors can ONLY sell products listed on their approved Vendor Application. The selling of lemonade, cotton candy, caramel & candy apples, caramel chips, snow cones, caramel corn, popcorn, funnel cakes and fried Oreos are NOT PERMITTED, due to our exclusive contract with LAM Enterprises. ANY vendor selling these forementioned items will be breaching their contract with the Ox Hill Community Fair.
- Concession Managers have the right to approach any vendor in breach of contract and ask the vendor to remove the product immediately.
- Concession spots are not guaranteed from year to year. All spots are at the discretion of the Concession Managers.
- 12. Concession application does not guarantee a spot on the grounds.
- Concession fees (down payments/payments in full) are non-refundable.

# **Entry Deadline**

- 1. Entry Deadline for the current fair year is August 25th
- 2. All entry fees must accompany the Entry Form at time of entry.
- 3. Make checks payable to Ox Hill Community Fair or O.H.C.A.F.
- 4. Entry Tags: Enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope with your entry form. Any return envelopes without the proper postage will be sent C.O.D. to the addressee.

# **Entry Fees**

10% of the First-Place premium, unless otherwise stated.

# **Exhibitors**

- 1. Are expected to provide a W-9 form for all awards more than \$600.00
- 2. Are expected to provide the proper name of the breed of livestock being entered.
- 3. Are expected to have all livestock on the grounds no later than 3:00pm on the opening Sunday of the Fair.
- 4. Are expected to provide the proper Department, Class, Section and Division when entering any articles or produce.
- 5. Are EXPECTED to have all entries on the grounds no later than 3:00pm on opening Sunday of the Fair. (Baked goods by 1:45pm).
- 6. Are expected to keep all entries on the premises until day of release.
- 7. Are expected to show their animals as directed by the Superintendent.
- 8. Are expected to enter only exhibits made, home grown or canned during the current fair year. Photos must be taken during the current fair year.
- 9. Exhibitors may have one (1) exhibit per class. Livestock exhibitors are limited to two (2) entries in each class except were stated otherwise.

# **Exhibit Entry Times and Dates**

- Equine/Donkeys/Cattle
   On grounds and stalled by 3:00 pm, opening Sunday of the Fair.
- Livestock/YMG
   On grounds, weighed, stalled/penned by 4:00 pm, opening Sunday of the Fair.
- 3. <u>Pre-Registered Articles/Produce</u> In Exhibit Building between the hours of 12:00 pm –3:00 pm, opening Sunday of the Fair. This includes Dept. 16.
- Baked Goods
   In Exhibit Building between the hours of 12:00 pm 1:45 pm, opening Sunday of the Fair. Judging begins at 2:00 pm.

# **Exhibit Release Times and Dates**

- 1. Livestock/YMG After Youth Market Sale.
- 2. Equine/Donkeys/Cattle Saturday after 10:00 pm or Sunday of fair end.
- 3. 4-H Round-up Equine entries Friday of the fair, after 10:00 pm.
- 4. Exhibit Building entries 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm Sunday of fair end.

# **Fairground Safety**

- The Ox Hill Community Fair Association will provide armed security guards during the Fair. The guards will be responsible to uphold any Rules and Regulations associated with the Ox Hill Fair. It is our intention to provide a safe and family orientated atmosphere for our attendees.
- 2. Persons entering the grounds visibly under the influence of any substance or in possession of alcohol, liquors, drugs or weapons will not be permitted entrance at any gate or pit area.
- 3. The Fair Association and Security Guards reserve the right to search any person or vehicle that is expected of concealing weapons, drugs or alcohol. All prohibited articles found become the property of the Fair Association. In cases where weapons have been found, the rightful owner can claim what is rightfully theirs at the Fair Office between the hours of 9:00pm & 10:00pm nightly.
- 4. Ox Hill Community Fair is a privately owned property. Therefore, it is unlawful to carry any firearm or weapon onto the property.

# General Livestock Rules (Rules adopted by PA Farm Show & Dept. of Agriculture)

- 1. **Stall/Pen** space will be provided until they are exhausted.
- 2. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to keep the space they occupy in a clean and sanitary condition. Stalls and pens are to be cleaned daily. There will be a stall cleaning fee that will be applied to any premium winnings if the exhibitor does not properly clean their assigned stalls before leaving the fairgrounds. A \$50.00 fee will be applied.
- 3. Feed and Water: Animals should be well fed and have access to clean water regularly. Realizing that many market animals must have restricted amounts of feed to maintain the proper weight, animals must be fed adequate amounts of feed to meet the animal's basic requirements. Animals not allowed reasonable access to feed and water will be disqualified from the show.
- 4. RESTRAINING ANIMALS: Animals should be tied or penned in a manner that will not hurt the animal or restrict its breathing in any way. Animals should be tied so that all four feet are firmly on the ground and they have enough room to stand comfortably and lie down. Animals should be tied so that they are not able to injure animals tied near them. Animals unaccustomed to each other should not be penned together. Animals may NOT be muzzled at any time.
- 5. Market Animals: Animals consigned for slaughter during or immediately following the show shall not receive any treatment with drugs or biologics within the withdrawal time prior to slaughter. Withdrawal times for drugs and biologics are all stated on the directions for use. Label directions must be followed at all times. A Drug Certification and Disclosure Statement must be submitted at weigh-in.
- 6. The use of inhumane fitting, showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited

# General Livestock Rules (Rules adopted by PA Farm Show & Dept. of Agriculture)

- Any exhibitor, parent of an exhibitor or family member that can not follow the Code of Show Ring Ethics, Health Rules for Livestock or General Livestock Rules will be dismissed from the fair and the exhibitor will forfeit any award, ribbon, premiums or sale proceeds.
- 8. Department 10 4-H/Vocational and Department 11 Youth Under 19 entries will use Department 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 9 for Livestock Sections, Divisions, Breeds, Classes, Fees and Premiums. Please use Department 10 or 11 on the entry form, followed by the corresponding Section, Division, Breeds and Classes in the forementioned Departments.
- 9. ALL YOUTH MARKET GROUP EXHIBITORS WILL USE DEPARTMENT 11 and the corresponding Sections, Division, Breed, Classes, Fees and Premiums. YOUTH MARKET GROUP EXHIBITORS in a 4-H Club, please choose Department 10.
- 10. Each livestock exhibitor limited to two (2) species.
- 11. The weigh-in weights of sheep, goats, swine and rabbits are official. Any complaints must be made at the time of weighing.
- Equine Shows will be held in the Horse Arena, unless otherwise stated.
   Youth Market Show and Sale will be held in the Livestock Barn Arena.

# **Health Rules for Livestock**

Health Rules are subject to change as mandated by PA Dept. of Agriculture www.agriculture.state.pa.us

Please see all Animal Health Requirements and Recommendations for Animal Exhibition, including Commercial Exhibition, found at the PA Dept. of Agriculture website. All animals admitted to Ox Hill Community Fair or Show shall be identified by a unique and permanent ear tag, tattoo, brand or records of unique physical attributes.

Animals known to be infected with or exposed to any contagious, infectious or external parasitic disease or restricted by quarantine may not be assembled for show purposes.

All animals must comply with applicable State 7 PA Code or Federal 9 CFR (Code of Federal Regulations) rules. Comply with the current Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture Animal Health Requirements and Recommendations for Animal Exhibition, including Commercial Exhibition. (Revised 01/05/2025).

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI). This is an official document issued by a federal, state, tribal, or accredited veterinarian certifying that the animals identified on the document have been inspected and were found to satisfy the regulations pertaining to their intended movement—within the same state, between states, or internationally.

(a) CVIs are required for all swine, both from out-of-state and from in-state, and out-of-state camelids, cattle, cervids, equines, goats, sheep, and rabbits. For in-state camelids, cattle, cervids, equines, goats, sheep, and rabbits, these guidelines list a CVI as recommended. A CVI serves as verification of animal ID, an attestation of health, an attestation of a Veterinarian-client-patient-relationship (VCPR), and documentation of applicable vaccination and testing.

Verification of Veterinarian-client-patient-relationship (VCPR): The Animal Exhibition Sanitation Law requires attestation that a VCPR exists for all animals to be exhibited. Please see each livestock department for more Health Rules.

# **Judging**

- In cases where there is no competition, judges may give an award such as they
  deem the exhibit is worthy to receive.
- 2. The same rule applies where there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered.
- 3. The judges, at their discretion, may award a ribbon or rosette. Any exhibit improperly entered will be disqualified to receive a premium, but the judges may mark the correct name on the entry tag for the benefit of the owner so the same mistake in entering need not be made the second time.
- 4. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to know the judging schedule. Animals must be in the ring promptly on call and a failure to comply with the order renders exhibitors liable to be ruled out of competition.
- 5. All livestock offered for premiums must have been the property of the owners thirty (30) days or longer, health papers are to be issued in the name of the exhibitor.
- The decision of the judges shall be final in all cases, except where
  mistakes, fraud or misrepresentation not discovered at the time of the award is
  proven.

# **Liability**

### 1. Premiums

In the event that the receipts of the Fair are insufficient to meet all expenses and to pay all premiums in full, the Ox Hill Community Fair Association reserves the right to prorate the funds available for premiums among the respective winners and payment on the prorated share, THROUGH less than the amount advertised, shall constitute a full and complete discharge of any premium obligation.

### 2. Personal and Property Damage

All persons who enter the fairgrounds and use the facilities on said grounds, at 1752 Mahoning Road, Home, PA 15747 for the purpose of exhibiting, displaying, competing or in any other manner participating in the Fair do so at their own risk. The Ox Hill Community Fair Association will not be liable for any personal injury or property damage suffered by any person visiting the Fair irrespective of how such injury or damage occurs. The Ox Hill Community Fair Association will not intentionally show or permit to be shown, any dangerous attractions on the grounds. However, the showing of certain attractions require that spectators be reasonably careful in their conduct and be reasonably watchful of the conduct of children; And although the Ox Hill Community Fair Association will take every precaution, it will not be responsible for any personal injury or property damaged suffered by reason of any attraction shown or exhibited during the Fair.

# **Office Hours**

The fair office hours are only held during the week of the fair. Hours are from the opening times of the fair to 11:00pm. The office is located in the back of the Exhibit Building. For questions concerning the Youth Market Group, please see any superintendent in the Livestock Barn.

# **Parking**

- Handicap Parking is available near the General Admission Entrance. It is on a first come, first served basis.
- 2. Parking is free.
- 3. Anyone parking in the Pit Area must sign a waiver form.
- 4. Anyone in the Pit Area must purchase a Pit Pass.

# Pets on the Fairgrounds

# 1. POSITIVELY NO DOGS or PETS PERMITTED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS; Trained Service Animals Only

All Dogs must have a valid dog license and registration. A permit from the Dept. of Agriculture for any service animals that will be used in public.

No pets/Dogs permitted on the fairgrounds, except trained service dogs as under the ADA act. Dogs that are not trained to perform tasks that mitigate the effects of a disability, including dogs that are used purely for emotional support, are not Service Animals and are not permitted on the fairgrounds. Support animals are not required to be trained to perform a specific job or task and therefore do not qualify as "Service Animals" under the ADA Act. Under this Act, owners of public accommodations are not required to allow emotional support animals, only service animals or animal assistants that aid those with disabilities. These laws do not apply to pets. Trained service dogs specifically trained to aid a person with a disability are welcome.

- 2. In situations where it is not obvious that the dog is a service animal, fair staff may ask theses specific questions:
  - Is the dog a service animal required because of a disability?
  - What work or task has the dog been trained to perform?
  - Proof of Rabies Vaccination.

# **Security**

Armed Security Guards will be present daily to enforce the Rules and Regulations of the fair.

# Ox Hill Community Fair Code of Show Ring Ethics

The National Code of Show Ring Ethics has been developed by the International Association of Fairs and Expositions. The Pennsylvania Farm Show has incorporated these rules and developed a Code of Show Ring Ethics to curtail unethical, deceptive, and fraudulent show ring practices. The Ox Hill Community Fair has adopted these such ethics and will abide by them. The Code is as follows: Exhibitors of animals at the Ox Hill Community Fair shall at all times conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at any livestock show. All youth leaders and superintendents working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards, and auction proceeds and may be prohibited from future exhibition at Ox Hill Community Fair. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

Youth leaders and superintendents who demean the integrity of the fair will be released immediately by the Fair Board. The following is a list of GUIDELINES for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events.

- All exhibitors must present, upon request of show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any fact relation thereto is prohibited.
- Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers or absolutely responsible persons shall
  provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by
  show officials.
- 3. All exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at the show.
- 4. Any drugs or implants injected or used shall be in accordance with USDA or FDA approved labels. All other surgical procedures, non-USDA or non-FDA approved substances, or illegal injection of any foreign substance or drug, including drenching and pumping of fluids, or the external application of any substance which could affect the animals performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hooves or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- The use of inhumane fitting, showing and/or handling practices or devices such
  as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other
  similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
- 6. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

# Ox Hill Community Fair Code of Show Ring Ethics

- 7. Animals shall be presented to the show or competition event free of unapproved or illegal drug residues. Market animals that will enter the food chain shall only use products that are solely in accordance with the USDA and FDA approved labels and administered according to label instructions of the product being used for the approved species being shown. Product withdrawals shall be in accordance to all labels, with sale day being the last day of the withdrawal period. Animals not entered in an event that culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal and state statutes, regulations, or rules. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show or contest is giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, and/or absolutely responsible person for Show Management to obtain any specimen of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used for testing. If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analvsis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise. At any time after an animal arrives on Ox Hill premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.
- 8. Direct interference with the judge, Show Management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, Show Management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
- 9. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics
- 10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the Commission for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the Commission may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members. Additionally, the name of those involved with any violations will be sent to all County Extension offices and The State Department of Vocational Agriculture.

# Ox Hill Community Fair Code of Show Ring Ethics

- 11. The act of entering an animal in the show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action that contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal and state statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.
- 12. Other cooperating shows, (The International Association of Fairs and Expositions, The American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association, and Western Fairs Association) will be notified of the action taken by the show management, which may affect the eligibility of the individual, group, or sponsoring organization for participation at other shows who are also members of these organizations.

By making entry in a livestock show or event you are verifying you have read "The Ox Hill Community Fair Show Ring Code of Ethics" and understand the consequences of the penalties involved for illegal, unethical, inhumane, and unfair practices of competition. You also verify that you and your family may be prohibited from future participation in organized fairs and livestock shows in the United States, and could face possible criminal prosecution and/or civil penalties if implicated in any of the aforementioned acts.

# **Superintendents**

- Will verify entries were grown, produced or made since the last fair, to the best of their ability.
- 2. Will have all animals stalled/penned before leaving for the day.
- Will have all entries accounted for, placed and checked off in Judges Book before leaving for the day.
- 4. Will take reasonable care to protect all exhibits on display from all injury and damage. However, the Superintendents and Fair is not in any way, to be held responsible for accidents, loss of damage by water, fire, theft or otherwise, whatever may be the cause or extent of the damage or loss.
- 5. Will see that entries are made according to classification.
- 6. Fair Management or Superintendent may at any time order the removal of any exhibit or part of an exhibit in poor condition during the fair.
- 7. Superintendents and their family members may enter in any department, but can not act as a judge. No person shall be allowed to act as a judge in any class wherein they may be an exhibitor.



# PA FAIR Equine Health Requirements for Departments 1, 10, 11

- Pennsylvania equines must have verification of a veterinary-client-patient relationship. A current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is required and must be completed within the 30 days prior to the fair. Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test results and date of the test must be included on the CVI; alternatively, a VCPR Form can also be used, or at a minimum, a signed attestation on the entry form, to fulfill the Animal Exhibition Sanitation Act.
- 2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
- 3. All equines must be test negative for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) also known as a Coggins Test, by an official test within the 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. Laboratory test results should accompany each animal (a copy of the original lab report is acceptable), and should include the date of sample collection. Foals less than six months of age accompanied by a test-negative dam are exempt from EIA testing recommendations. If the foal is not accompanied by the dam, a copy of the dam's test results must accompany the foal.
- 4. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older. However, if a mare was currently vaccinated against rabies when she foaled, the foal is not required to be vaccinated until six months of age, with a second vaccination administered two to four weeks later. All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated equine animals must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable. Rabies vaccines must be administered at least one month, but not more than 12 months before the opening date of the fair.
- 5. The Ox Hill Fair recommends the following vaccinations to prevent contagious diseases. West Nile Virus vaccine, 5-Way vaccine and Strep vaccine.

### Fair General Regulations for Departments 1, 10, 11

- 1. All animals must be provided with fresh water at all times and fed daily. Stalls must be kept clean and tack areas kept in a orderly fashion.
- Any persons mistreating any animal will be asked to leave the premises immediately and the proper authorities will be informed.
- 3. Stall Cards and Entry Tags must be hung when animals are stalled.
- 4. Only 4-H Round-up competitors are excused on Friday of the fair.
- 5. The Fair Board reserves the right to adjust any premium where there is no competition.

### Fair Regulations - Day of Judging

- Exhibitor can compete in two (2) Departments only. Department 1, open to 8 years and up.
   Department 10, 4-H & Vocational Club Members only.
  - Department 11, 9-11 & Vocational Club Members only.

    Department 11, open to youth ages 5-19 years and not in a 4-H or Vocational Club.
- 2. NO Equine shall be entitled to a premium unless healthy and serviceably sound.
- 3. ALL Equine entered must compete and be shown to receive any award or premium.
- 4. A animal may be shown ONLY by the person in whose name the animal was entered.
- Riders and horse must perform in the Horse Arena on day of Judging. In case of inclement weather where the arena is not safe for the horse, the scheduled rain date will take affect; unless stated otherwise.
- Horses, ponies and donkeys that are entered in the Halter Classes, may compete as scheduled during inclement weather at the consent of the Fair Board in the camping area.
- 7. All Performance, Gaming and Youth Shows must be performed in the Horse Arena.
- 8. All "timed" events must be recorded and submitted with the judges book.
- 9. Ponies and Miniatures' entered in the Cart/Driving Classes, may compete as scheduled during inclement weather at the consent of the Fair Board in the camping area.
- 10. In cases where there is NO competition, the Fair Board reserves the right to adjust the premiums in a class where there is only one (1) competitor.
- 11. In cases where there is no judging of a Department, Section or Class due to inclement weather, NO awards or premiums will be awarded. The entry fees for each rider will be reimbursed when judging has not taken place due to inclement weather conditions for those such Departments, Sections and Classes.
- 12. All riders must wear riding attire, including helmets, long pants and boots with a heel.
- 13. The adopted Code of Show Ring Ethics will be enforced.

### PA FAIR Cattle Health Requirements for Departments 2, 3, 10, 11 Revised 5-30-24

Prohibition of exhibition of Dairy Cattle:

Dairy cattle from a premises on which dairy animals are showing clinical signs of infection with influenza A virus are prohibited from entering an exhibition. Animals showing clinical signs compatible with infection must be cleared by the State Animal Health Official. Dairy cattle which have been on a premises where influenza A virus has been confirmed in dairy cattle are prohibited from entering an exhibition until that premises has been declared free of disease by the State Animal Health Official. Dairy cattle which have been on a premises where influenza A virus has been confirmed in domestic birds are prohibited from entering an exhibition until that premises has been declared free of disease by the State Animal Health Official.

### Cattle Requirements & Recommendations:

- 1. Pennsylvania cattle must have verification of a veterinary-client-patient relationship. A current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is required and must be completed within the 30 days prior to the fair.
- 2. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases.
- 3. Official identification is required for all cattle. Official identification includes any of the following: (a) A USDA issued National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES) tag if applied prior to Nov. 5, 2024. This tag type is no longer valid for interstate movement if applied after Nov. 5, 2024. (b) A 15-digit Animal Identification Number (AIN) ear tag starting with "840".
- 4. 840-button tag must be used if tagged after November 15, 2024
- 5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian for animals 3 months of age and older.

### Fair Regulations for Departments 2, 3, 10, 11

- 1. All animals must be provided with fresh water at all times and fed daily. Stalls must be kept clean and tack areas kept in a orderly fashion. Exhibitors must furnish their own bedding, (no newspapers).
- Any persons mistreating any animal will be asked to leave the premises immediately and the proper authorities will be informed.
- 3. The Fair reserves the right to refuse any or all entries.
- 4. No entries will be accepted once stall space has been exhausted.
- 5. Entry fees are non-refundable.

# DEPARTMENTS 2 & 3 CATTLE

### Fair Regulations - Day of Judging

- Exhibitor can compete in two (2) Departments only. Department 2, open to 8 years and up. Department 3, open to 8 years and up. Department 10, 4-H & Vocational Club Members only. Department 11, open to youth ages 5-19 years and not in a 4-H or Vocational Club.
- 2. NO Cattle shall be entitled to a premium unless healthy and serviceably sound.
- 3. ALL Cattle entered must compete and be shown to receive any award or premium.
- 4. An animal may be shown ONLY by the person in whose name the animal was entered.
- 5. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to know the judging schedule. Animals must be in the ring promptly on call and a failure to comply with the order renders exhibitors liable to be ruled out of competition.
- Exhibitors will be expected to display or parade their animals as directed by the Superintendent and Judge.
- 7. Animals must be shown individually before entering group classes.
- 8. An animal in a Class will not be able to win more than one (1) place.
- 9. All animals in a Class will be judged together.
- 10. In cases where there is NO competition, the Fair Board reserves the right to adjust the premiums in a class where there is only one (1) competitor.
- 11. The adopted Code of Show Ring Ethics will be enforced.



#### PA FAIR Sheep Health Requirements for Departments 4, 10, 11

- Individual Official USDA scrapie animal identification is required. Official scrapie I.D. includes:
  - a. A scrapie eartag
  - b. A scrapie tattoo
  - c. An ISO-complaint RFID tag

(animals bearing identification with blue colored scrapie program tags labelled "meat" with a US shield are not permitted to be exhibited in Pennsylvania). Please call the Department at 717-772-2852 if such a tag is encountered).

- 4. For post-exhibition sales the following requirements apply:
  - (a) Market sheep must be documented on sales slips which contain all of the following information:
  - (i) Official identification (as described above) (ii) Sale date (iii) Sale location (iv) Name, address, and phone number of the exhibitor (v) Hauler contact information (vi) Destination name and contact information (vii) Total number of animals in the shipment (viii) Type of sheep or goat (i.e., meat, dairy, specific breed) (ix) For sheep, face color (x) Signature of consignee, agent, or hauler
  - (b) Sales slips, or a document containing all of the information required under subsection (a) above, must follow the sheep or goats to their final destination (including slaughter facilities).
  - (c) Sheep or goats which are purchased with the intent of breeding and are traveling via interstate movement must have a valid Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) prior to movement to the destination state.
  - (d) A copy of the sale records slips as delineated above and a copy of any CVI, required under subsection
  - (e) above, must be kept by the sale organizer for 5 years.
- 5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for sheep 3 months of age and older. (Market sheep are exempt from this vaccination requirement.)

All entries must be weighed on the same set of scales under a qualified person at the discretion of the Youth Market committee member on Sunday, August 31, 2025. Lambs must weigh between 70-150 lbs. #### PA FAIR Swine Health Requirements for Departments 5, 10, 11

- 1. Immediately prior to unloading at the exhibition, all swine must be visually inspected and found to be free of signs of contagious disease by an accredited veterinarian or swine health monitor appointed by the fair board or livestock show committee.
- All swine at an exhibition must be inspected daily by a certified swine health monitor appointed by the fair or show/event organizers.
  - (i) Swine health monitors must complete annual online training found at extension.psu.edu/Pennsylvania-show-and-fair-swine-health-monitor-training.
  - (ii) Swine health monitors must provide a current completion certificate to the fair or show staff they will be performing monitoring services for prior to the start of the event.
- 3. All market swine exhibited in Department sponsored or funded market shows shall move as all-in and all-out directly to a Department or USDA licensed slaughter facility following the animal exhibition and may not be diverted to premises other than a recognized slaughter establishment or a slaughter market in which the sales are designated slaughter-only sales. Shows should keep records of all sales for a minimum of 2 years and provide these upon request to the Department.
- 4. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the date of the exhibition.
- 5. Official identification is required for all swine and must be an official 840 series RFID ear tag. This number must appear on the CVI.
- Recommendation: Extra-label use of the rabies vaccine in this species should be discussed with the exhibitor's veterinarian.

#### DEPARTMENT 5 SWINE

- 7. Shows that are not sponsored by or that do not receive funding from the Department, including jackpot shows and 4-H roundups, not occurring during a Department sponsored or funded fair or show are exempt from the terminal slaughter requirement only if the following conditions are adhered to:
  - (a) The swine shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the 30 days prior to the date of the exhibition and shall be permanently identified by an 840 series RFID identification ear tag.
  - (b) Arrival, exhibition and departure of the swine shall occur within a 72-hour window. Time begins when the first swine arrives physically on the exhibition grounds, whether unloaded from a trailer or not, and ends when the last hog physically leaves the premises on a trailer.
  - (c) There shall be no public access to the animals other than observation during competitions.
  - (d) An accredited veterinarian or trained swine health monitor shall have visually inspected the animals prior to unloading and found each animal to be free of signs of contagious disease.
  - (e) An accredited veterinarian or trained swine health monitor shall monitor and record the health of the pigs daily for signs of contagious disease, and the accredited veterinarian shall immediately report suspicion of disease to the State Animal Health Official.
  - (f) A Veterinary-client-patient-relationship is established between the show committee/management staff and an accredited veterinarian, and that veterinarian is readily available for health monitoring, emergency coverage, treatment, follow up evaluation, and prompt reporting of suspicion of disease to the State Animal Health Official.
- 8. A conveyance used for the transportation of swine to animal exhibitions, fairs and shows shall be cleaned and disinfected by an exhibitor prior to each use and shall be free of visible accumulations of manure, bedding and other organic materials.
- 9. At the conclusion of swine animal exhibitions, fairs and shows and after all swine have left the premises, the livestock show committee shall ensure all holding pens and animal exhibition areas have had all bedding and other organic material removed and all areas, including fences, gates, stalls, holding pens, containers, housing, coming in contact with or through which swine were moved shall be put through the livestock show committee's cleaning and disinfection process.



#### DEPARTMENT 5 SWINE

#### Fair Requirements for Departments 5, 10, 11

In cases where there is NO competition, the Fair Board reserves the right to adjust the premiums in a class where there is only one competitor.

- 1. Minimum weight 225 pounds; maximum weight 300 pounds. The weight of each animal will be announced. No re-weighs.
- 2. Market class animals can be barrows and/or gilts. Barrows must be exhibited as market swine.
- 3. Market hogs will be limited to a maximum of 2 per exhibitor. Two (2) Market hogs will be sold.
- 4. Market hogs must be owned and in possession of exhibitor by the Saturday following Mother's Day.
- Classes should not exceed 10 animals.
- 6. Restraining of hogs is prohibited. Any abuse with sticks or whips will not be tolerated.
- Any market swine showing signs of being a boar shall be eliminated from the show.
- 8. Exhibitor must provide own bedding no newspaper.
- 9. All animals must be provided with fresh water at all times and fed daily.
- 10. The adopted Code of Show Ring Ethics will be enforced.

- 2. Animals appearing unhealthy or showing visible signs of contagious disease, upon arrival may not enter the fairgrounds.
- Individual Official USDA scrapie animal identification is required. Official scrapie I.D. includes:
  - (a) A USDA ear tag with a US shield; which includes scrapie program tags (animals bearing identification with blue colored scrapie program tags labelled "meat" with a US shield are not permitted to be exhibited in Pennsylvania). Please call the Department at 717-772-2852 if such a tag is encountered).
  - (b) A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database (Scrapie tattoo – flock ID in the right ear, state postal code and letters/numbers and individual animal ID in the left ear).
  - (c) A breed registration tattoo if the animal is accompanied by a registration certificate and the tattoo is legible.
- 4. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this should be written on the CVI.
- Extra-label use of the rabies vaccine in goats should be discussed with the exhibitor's veterinarian.

#### Fair Requirements for Departments 6, 10, 11

In cases where there is NO competition, the Fair Board reserves the right to adjust the premiums in a class where there is only one competitor.

- 1. Each Market Goat Wether will be weighed and assigned to a weight class. Weigh-in will be Sunday of the Fair.
- 2. All goats must weigh 50 lb. and not over 120 lb. The weight of each animal will be announced. Goats weighing under 50 lb. and over 120 lb. will be sent home immediately. NO re-weighs.
- 3. Exhibitors are limited to two (2) entries.
- 4. Market goats must be owned and in possession of the Exhibitor by Saturday after Mother's Day of the current year.
- 5. Market goats may be does or wethers.
- 6. Exhibitors will be expected to display or parade their animals as directed by the Superintendents, to accept the stall assigned without controversy; to keep their animals in an attractive appearance, and to cooperate with the Department in every way that may serve to increase the educational value of the show.

#### Fair Requirements for Departments 6, 10, 11

- 7. Restraining is prohibited. Any abuse towards any animal will not be tolerated.
- 8. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to know the judging schedule. Animals must be in the ring promptly on call and a failure to comply with the order renders exhibitors liable to be ruled out of competition.

#### PA FAIR Rabbit Health Requirements for Departments 9, 10, 11

- Pennsylvania rabbits must have verification of a veterinary-client-patient relationship (see Chapter A.6). A current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) (valid for 30 days after the date of issue) is preferred; alternatively, a VCPR Form can also be used, or at a minimum, a signed attestation on the entry form, to fulfill the Animal Exhibition Sanitation Act.
- 2. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases.
- 3. While on exhibit or at any time following exhibition, exhibitors and exhibition managers are obligated to report all mass mortality events and all rabbits who show signs of a dangerous transmissible disease to the Department's emergency line at 717-772-2852, option 1. Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease is of particular concern, and clinical signs include bleeding from eyes, nose, mouth, or have bloody stools.
- 4. Vaccination against RHDV-2: Vaccination of Pennsylvania origin rabbits against RHDV-2 is encouraged.

#### Fair Requirements for Departments 9, 10, 11

- All breeds recognized by the American Rabbit Breeders Association are eligible for competition and are to be judged according to the latest standard of perfection of the association. ARBA rules will govern.
- 2. All rabbits must be identified by a tattoo in the left ear. (put on entry blank)
- 3. Pen must consist of three (3) rabbits.
- 4. Each exhibitor limited to 1 entry per class.
- No rabbit may compete in more than one class. Rabbits can not compete in single and pen. Three singles cannot compete as a pen.
- 6. All rabbits must be weighed\* upon arrival at the fairgrounds.
- 7. \*WEIGHTS:
  Market Rabbits 4-9lbs.
  Pen of Meat Rabbits 3-8lbs.
- 8. No rabbits under 8 weeks old can be entered in show.
- 9. Entry deadline is August 25th of current fair year.
- 10. No animal shall be entitled to more than one premium, per class.
- 11. No entries will be accepted after all pen spaces are exhausted.

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#### **RULES and REGULATIONS**

4-H is a youth education program of Penn State Cooperative Extension. It is a non-formal education program for youth between the ages of 8 and 18. Cloverbuds are children between 5 and 7 years old before January 1 of the current year. These members engage with age-appropriate educational opportunities that are non-competitive. Youth between 8 and 18 years old before January 1 of the current year, living anywhere in Pennsylvania, can join the program and participate in educational and competitive events. FFA students must be a member of a Chapter. Exhibitors must enter under either 4-H or FFA, but cannot enter as both. Place your Club name or FFA Chapter name on your entry form.

Exhibitors must be members of a regularly organized 4-H Club, carrying a project in the field they wish to make entry and be following established 4-H rules and guidelines.

4-H fair entries must have been completed during the current 4-H Club year.

Each exhibit will be judged on the recognized 4-H Club standard and must meet completion requirements.

If exhibit is not worthy of premium, none will be given.

4-H and FFA members must be present and must have charge of his/her animal at time of judging. Unethical behavior towards any animal will not be tolerated and the member will be asked to leave the fairgrounds.

Current health rules and regulations apply for all Livestock entries.



YOUTH MARKET EXHIBITORS ENTERING LIVESTOCK WILL USE DEPARTMENT 11 AND NOT DEPARTMENT 10, UNLESS THEY ARE A 4-H CLUB MEMBER.. PLEASE PLACE DEPARTMENT 11 ON YOUR LIVESTOCK ENTRY FORM.

- 1. Each Exhibitor may enter in Department 11, as well as other "Junior Divisions" found in other Departments. They cannot enter in Department 10, 4-H/Vocational.
- All General Rules, Regulations and Information applies and can be found in this booklet. Livestock Health Rules and all Regulations apply, including the Code of Show Ring Ethics.
- 3. Livestock must be fed and have fresh water daily, pens and stalls must be kept clean.
- 4. An individual animal may be shown as a market exhibit or a breeding exhibit, but the same individual animal may not be exhibited in both market and breeding classes.
- 5. If exhibit is not worthy of premium, none will be given.
- 6. Non-livestock entries must have been completed by the exhibitor during the current year.
- 7. Exhibitors may also enter livestock, produce or articles in any other Department, **except** for Department 10, 4-H. Please place youth's age on all entry forms.





#### RULES & REGULATIONS GOVERNING VEGETABLES

- In selecting vegetables for exhibition, choose such specimens that would bring the highest market price. Do not select the largest. Select the medium size specimens. If at all possible do not mix varieties. Must be home-grown.
- 2. The following factors are generally used by an expert vegetable judge.
  - a. Trueness to variety type. Pick specimens from one variety.
  - b. Uniformity in shape, size and color.
  - c. Be sure to pick out the perfect specimen, then select others as similar as possible. Never mix specimens of different maturity.
  - d. Protect from dirt, disease, infection and mechanical damage. Select specimens that are perfect and show no blemishes of any kind.
  - e. Conditions and maturity. Be sure that exhibits are of high quality.
  - f. Potatoes should not be washed. Remove soil by using a soft cloth or brush.
  - g. Tomatoes should have stems removed. Carrots, beets, etc., should have tops (leaves) removed from vegetable leaving about 2 inches of stems.
- 3. Read premium material carefully following all rules and regulations. If an entry calls for 5 specimens, be sure to enter that number; no more or less. Any entry that has more or less than stated, will not be judged.



### **SECTION 1 - ANTIQUE TRACTOR PULLS**

### ANTIQUE TRACTOR PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. One driver per tractor, per class.
- 2. All classes require a minimum of 5 pullers to receive full payout.
- 3. One hook per tractor per class. Same tractor can only pull in 2 classes a night.
- SIGNING IN -You must be signed in and registered before a weight class starts to be entered in that weight class.
- 5. Registration ends when class is called to line-up. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 6. Antique/Stock Classes, tractor must be older than 1960 or in production prior to 1960.
- 7. DRIVER Drivers must stay in the seat of the tractor at all times. No bouncing in the seat is permitted. Hands or hand must be on the steering wheel, hand brakes, hand clutch, or throttle at all times during the pull. Never try to start a tractor by pushing it off the scale. No one except the driver is to be on a moving tractor. No riders allowed on moving tractor. Anytime a tractor is moving the driver is required to be seated down in the seat. Driver must be in the seat when starting the tractor. Tractor is to not exceed a 4-mph speed limit off the track or in the pit area.
- 8. WEIGHING IN Each Tractor is required to weigh in on the scales and to have their hitch height checked before they can hook to the sled. This is required for each and every time you pull in a different weight class. If there is no one there at the scales you are still required to check your weight and hitch height. DO NOT spend the day on the scales. Have courtesy for the other entries and pullers.
- WEIGHT Suitcase or custom-made weights allowed in all classes. All weights must be stationary and safely secured. There is no allowance on weight for any class. Weight of class is maximum weight allowed.
- 10. WEIGHT BRACKETS- Suitcase weights and custom-made weight brackets are permitted, front weight bracket and weights to extend no farther than 11 feet from center of rear axle. Weights may not extend behind rear tires.
- 11. WEIGHT OR PART FALLING OFF Any part or weight falling off the tractor after being hooked, during the pull and until the tractor is unhooked from the sled, will result as a (DQ) disqualification. No measurement will be taken after a disqualification or refunds given. (DO NOT touch an unsecured or partially hanging weight/part until the tractor is unhooked from the sled).
- 12. STOCK CLASS HITCHES Minimum 18" back from the center of the rear axle and a maximum of 18" drawbar height. Hitch material cannot be thinner than 3/4" and not thicker than 1.25". Hitch must have a 3.00" hole with 1" material thickness around the hole or a straight clevis bolted or pinned tightly to the drawbar with a minimum of 3.75" hole in hitch or clevis. Top of hitch adjuster cannot be above factory anchor or top of axle or hub.
- 13. HITCHES, ALL CLASSES Hitches and drawbars must be stationary in all directions. Hitch must be easily accessible (sled operator's discretion).

### ANTIQUE TRACTOR PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- DRAWBAR, ANTIQUE CLASSES Drawbar will be a maximum of 18" in all Antique Classes.
- DRAWBAR, OPEN CLASSES Drawbar will be a maximum of 20" in all Open Classes.
- TIRES, ALL CLASSES Tires NOT allowed: radial, duals, tire chains/studded or steel wheels. No dual wheels or 4WD permitted.
- 17. STOCK TIRE SIZE Maximum tire size 4500lb.-5500lb. will be 15.5 x 38
- 18. STOCK TIRE SIZE Maximum tire size 6500lb.-7500lb, will be 16.9 x 38
- 19. STOCK TIRE SIZE Maximum tire size 8500lb. 18.4 x 38
- 20. STOCK TIRE - Top cut tires are permitted. <u>Full cut</u> or <u>shaved</u> tires are NOT permitted
- 21. OPEN TIRE Open Class tires can be shaved or cut.
- 22. CHASSIS All Stock & Open Tractors must maintain a stock/factory wheelbase for that make and model tractor. Rear wheels, differentials and frontends must maintain stock/factory location and wheelbase. Must be stock/factory appearing in location. Tractors in question will be judged and ruled by Ox Hill Fair board and tech committee.
- 23. No tampering of hydraulic control drawbar while pulling.
- 24. No turbo or blowers. Tractors with non-tractor engines are not permitted. Tractor must have stock block to pull in Stock Classes.
- 25. RPM's RPM's allowed will be determined by the NATPA RPM Chart. Any tractor not listed will use manufacturers or Nebraska Tests Data. All tractors must have a positive throttle stop with a working governor in the stock location. A Tech Official can check a tractor's RPM at their discretion. If a tractor is found over the given RPM percentage of that make and model, they will be counted as a (DQ) disqualification for that weight class entered.
- 26. SPEED Any gear, speed limit is 4 MPH, to be checked by sled operator. NO shifting of TA. One beep after flag/cone will result in disqualification. No refunds will be given.
- 27. FLAG & TRACK OFFICALS You will line up when your weight class is ready to start and not before. You will be asked to hook to the sled and then go forward until the chain to the pulling sled is tight. The flag person will show you a Green Flag before you can take off. You will not take off until you get the Green Flag. When you see the Red Flag at any time, you must STOP! The flag person will stop you if you are not making any more forward progress with the sled or for a safety and or equipment problems or issues. If the flag person feels your front end of the tractor is too high or the driver can no longer maintain safe control; you will also be Red flagged and stopped at that time. If you continue with your pull after being Red flagged, you will be disqualified from that class. If you do it again, you will be asked to leave the tractor pulls. No refunds will be given.
- 28. BARRED Any tractor or puller found to be unsafe, unruly and illegal or does not follow or respect the rules and regulations of the Ox Hill Community Fair; may be disqualified or barred and or banned from hooking. No refunds will be given.

### ANTIQUE TRACTOR PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 29. OUT OF BOUNDS Contact point of tractor and or sled must remain in bounds at all times. Out of bounds will result in (DQ) disqualification. No measurement will be taken after a disqualification or refunds given.
- 30. SAFETY Open Class Tractors must be equipped with a high back seat measured 7" from the base or cushion. Fenders and a dead man's throttle are mandatory (except for hand clutch models). Fenders must be as high as the tallest part of the rear tire and must support the weight of the driver. An approved SFI certified safety blanket is required. The installation and fastening method will secure the blanket in place to sustain fragment containment in case of an explosion.
- 31. FIRE EXTINGUISHERS All Open Class Tractors are expected to carry a fire extinguisher. All fire extinguishers must be easily accessible and up to date. It is highly recommended that All Stock Tractors also have a fire extinguisher that is easily accessible and up to date.
- 32. ALCOHOL & BEHAVIOR Alcoholic beverages or substances are not permitted on the fairgrounds and will not be tolerated. Anyone in possession of or intoxicated will be asked to leave the premises immediately. No abusive or aggressive language or behavior will be tolerated on or off the track. Those engaging in such behavior will be escorted off the premises.
- 33. The Ox Hill Fair reserves the right to adjust or make changes to anything in Section 1; Antique Tractor Pull as they see fit.

- 1. Can be driven or trailered to fairgrounds.
- 2. One driver per vehicle, per night. (exception: Junior Class)
- 3. Must be 16 years of age or older to enter any class.
- 4. All vehicles with state inspection will pull in only 1 class.
- 5. No one other than the driver permitted in truck while truck is pulling. (exception: Junior Class. Adult must be in with the junior driver).
- 6. Entries close at start of class.
- 7. Driver should use caution in the pits and when entering the pulling area. Use caution when backing into the sled and be aware of the track event crew.
- 8. Vehicle and sled must remain in boundaries during pull. Crossing a boundary line will result in disqualification. No refunds will be given.

### 5.000lb. LIGHT MODIFIED 4x4 TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Maximum weight of 5,000 lbs.

### 2. Engine:

Single four-barrel carburetor; must be naturally aspirated, must be mass-produced. 4150 style carburetors. Two-barrel carburetor; no predators, dominators, or exotic carbs permitted. Fuel injection is <u>not</u> permitted. Aluminum intakes are permitted. No tunnel rams or sheet metal intakes. Small block engines; 360 cubic inch maximum. No LS or Hemi style blocks or heads are permitted. All heads must be OEM valve angle. Cleveland Heads are <u>not</u> permitted. SFI harmonic balancer is required. SFI flex plate and flywheel are required. Engine fans must be completely shrouded with steel 1/16-inch or thicker. All exhaust systems must discharge vertically. Aftermarket ignition is permitted. Rear of engine block can be no far further than the center of the front axle and engine must be behind the factory grill location. Must have sparkplug shield plates.

### 3. Fuel:

Gasoline or racing fuel is permitted. No alcohol, no nitromethane, E85, or oxygenated fuel permitted. No blowers, turbochargers, or other compressed gasses (nitrous oxide, propane, etc.)

### 4. Transmission & Driveline:

All universal joints MUST be covered with 6-inch wide 1/8-inch steel or 3/16-inch aluminum. All drive shafts MUST have a midpoint safety loop. Any OEM transmission and transfer case can be used, no aftermarket gear boxes or t-cases. Factory 1-ton or less driveline (rear ends, transmission, transfer case). All automatic transmissions MUST use a properly attached blanket that covers the transmission clutch and also the bell housing. Two separate blankets may be used. Will also need a SFI flex plate shield. All automatic transmissions MUST have a positive reverse gear lock out; MUST have a neutral safety start switch, (standard can work off a pressed in clutch). All vehicles equipped with a manual transmission MUST have a flywheel shield labeled as meeting minimum SFI Spec 6.3 or greater. Applications for which an SFI Spec flywheel shield is no available may use a properly attached SFI 4.1 or 4.2 blanket that completely covers the bell housing may be used in place of a shield; it must be attached to the block and extend rearward to the transmission with a minimum 6-inch overlap where it is fastened. Both front brakes must work and driveline brakes are permitted. Slipper clutches and high stall torque converters are permitted. A clutch meeting minimum SFI Spec 1.1 or 1.2 is mandatory on all vehicles. Positivity NO Grey Cast Clutch materials allowed. Axle & hub shields are required. Shield to be .60inch thickness steel or aluminum. A hole may be cut in one shield to allow operation of hub lock. Non full float rear ends must have C-clip eliminators.

### 5. Body & Chassis:

Maximum wheelbase of 135. Must be a truck body with bed. Vehicles must have closed doors, unless equipped from factory with a fabric top. Half cabs must have closed doors. Vehicles must have stock appearing frill, hood, front fenders, bedsides, and hood. No weights or any part of the vehicle can extend forward more than 60-inches from the center front axle. Fuel cell must be located OUTSIDE of the cab with a marked easily accessible fuel shut-off valve. Batteries must be securely mounted, may be in stock location, in bed or mounted on the front weight rack/box. An a manual battery disconnect easily accessible and clearly marked is required. If batteries are mounted inside the cab, they must be covered with steel or aluminum with a driver accessible battery shut-off and be clearly marked. Must retain all exterior body panels fiberglass is permitted. Tailgate not required. Fenders may be cut for tire clearance only; axle must be positioned within 6-inch of center of wheel well. Must have windshield and driver's window. Driver's window must be up while pulling.

### 5,000lb. MODIFIED 4x4 TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

6. Body & Chassis: Continued

Floor and firewall area must be covered and no holes larger than 1-inch. Any motor, frame, body combo can be used; tube frames are allowed but must be inspected b current tech official before permitted to pull. 2-inch x .120 wall thickness minimum. Vehicle must have factory working reverse light or 2-inch round minimum light centered over the hitch.

### 7. Wheels & Tires:

DOT 33/14.5 or equivalent. 29/11 dirt track tires are permitted. No bar tires permitted, sipping and sanding of tires are permitted for the purpose of resurfacing ONLY. Cleaning up existing tire grooves or cutting new dirt track tires is permitted. Rear tires can be offset inward to center of front tires, no dual tires. Tire tracks must half lap. No recaps.

8. Suspension & Hitch:

Solid suspension is permitted in the rear. Ladder bars are permitted. Hitch must be rigid in ALL directions. Hitch plate is to be 3-inches wide and 4-inches long inside dimension. 1-inch thick at any point. Maximum hitch height will be 26-inches. Minimum hitch length is 27% of truck overall wheelbase no shorter than 24-inches. Measurement taken from center of axle tube to hook point. Hitch pivot or attachment point cannot b any further forward than the center of the rear axle.

9. Safety:

<u>Kill Świtch:</u> MUST break current or ground ignition. Vehicles equipped with electric fuel pumps must also break current to the fuel pump. Kill switches will be securely mounted to the back of the vehicle and have a 2-inch diameter metal ring, at least 1/8-inch thick to attach to the sled.

<u>Driver Safety/Clothing</u>: Fire suits are required. Over the ankle leather boots or racing shoes are required. Helmets are required while operating vehicle, full face is recommended. Driver's must be seated and in control of the pulling vehicle any time the motor is started or being started. Seat Belts must be worn while operating, factory seat belts in good condition are ok, but a five-point harness is highly recommended.

- 1. Showroom Gas Small Block 412 C.I. & less 6500lb.
- 2. Showroom Gas Big Block 413 C.I. & up to 6800 lb.
- 3. Two add-ons or modifications are allowed. Add on being- aluminum intake-headers-Holley carburetor
- 4. Rough idle will be considered a modification.
- 5. Vehicle should sound and look like an everyday driver. Must run on pump gas.
- 6. Inspection and license necessary, owner's card and insurance card may be asked for to verify legality of vehicle.
- 7. DOT tires only tread can be no deeper than original tread.
- 8. Must pull off of bumper or Reese hitch hitch point must be rear most part of vehicle.
- 9. Hitch point can be no higher than frame.
- 10. No heavy front bumpers or hang weights. Snow plow rigging allowed.

### SHOWROOM GAS 4x4 TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 11. Weights can be put in bed none in cab. Must be secured. Weights that fall off will result in a DQ.
- 12. No weights under hood. This will be checked before, during and after class is pulled.
- 13. POSI-traction carriers allowed. No welded carriers or spools permitted in front rear.
- 14. Compression ratio should be no higher than year of truck being pulled.
- 15. 10-inch-wide rim allowed, 12-inch tread width.
- 16. A fully functional front and rear suspension is required.
- 17. Suspension must have a minimum of 2-inches of travel.
- 18. Traction bars or Clamp suspension allowed.

### STOCK DIESEL 4x4 TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. May not exceed 8500lbs. with driver.
- 2. Must have current license, registration, inspection, and insurance card.
- 3. Be stock appearing and the floor in bed must be solid.
- 4. Be powered by the OEM diesel engine for the make and model year of the truck.
- 5. Must have factory manufactured wheel base.
- 6. Must be available for under hood inspection.
- 7. Diesel fuel only in diesel trucks. (No water injection, alcohol, propane or nitrous. (Nitrous bottle must be removed, if so equipped)
- 8. No studded, cut, or grooved tires or any other tires not intended for street use. No tire chains. Tires must have stamped DOT number on sidewall and be a maximum height of 35".
- All added weight must be placed inside of truck bed and secured to prevent weight from sliding around in truck bed. No weight brackets, boxes and hanging weights. NO weights allowed in cab.
- 10. Original front and rear axles must be used: raising or lowering of truck height with suspension modifications is permitted.
- 11. A fully functional front and rear suspension is required. No blocking suspension traction stabilizer bars, spring-clamps, or locking of springs is allowed.
- 12. Front and rear bumpers must remain unaltered and in their factory position. No home manufactured bumpers allowed. Snowplow frames and brush guards are allowed. Tailgate or cargo net must be in place.
- 13. The hitch point must be from OEM Factory style receiver hitch, mounted in the factory designed position. ABSOLUTELY no other hitch designs are permitted. Maximum hitch point allowance is 26" from top of hitch of level ground. Hitch must be rigid in all directions, pulling ring must have a 3" wide 3 3/4" long opening. No vertical hitch or opening. Hitch hook point must be the furthest point to the back of the truck.
- 14. Receiver hitch MUST be in place on truck at scale weigh-in.
- 15. Traction bars or Clamp suspension allowed.
- 16. Any computer programmer or chip is permitted. Air cleaner and components required.

### OPEN STREET GAS 4x4 TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. This is a street legal 4x4 truck class. Weight class is 6,800 lbs.
- 2. BATTERIES Batteries must remain inside the engine compartment and must be securely fastened. No batteries allowed inside the cab.
- 3. BRAKES Four-wheel hydraulic brakes are mandatory.
- 4. BODY The body must be an OEM truck body, the complete OEM floor pan and complete OEM firewall is mandatory. All body panels including in the inner and outer skins of the truck bed as well as the bed floor must be OEM. Floor in bed must be solid, wooden flatbeds are permitted. Other design modifications to reduce weight are not permitted. Fiberglass hoods and/or fiberglass hood scoops are permitted. Hood must be closed and securely latched during competition. Front bumpers must be factory stock. No weighted front devices are permitted, this includes but is not limited to homemade bumpers, brush guards, "Ranch Hand" type bumpers, and winches. Lower brackets (only) for snow-plow frames are permitted so long as no modifications that would add weight are determined. An unaltered decorative brush guard may be permitted at the option of the head official. A truck is permitted to compete without a front bumper.
- 5. CHASSIS The vehicle must retain the full OEM chassis, one-ton or smaller. No tube or homemade frames/chassis permitted. The wheelbase may not be changed from the original manufacturer. Front and rear wheels must be centered in the wheel wells of the body. The engine must be in the OEM location for the body used. Wheel tubs, back-half conversions, tube chassis, etc., are prohibited. Maximum width of 96 inches.
- 6. CREDENTIALS All drivers must have a valid driver's license. Current registration, inspection sticker, and current photo driver's license required. Inspection and registration must be from the same state. A license plate with a current sticker tag is required to be affixed to the truck. Trucks may be hauled to the pull.
- 7. DRIVELINE Transmission & DRIVELINE Transmission & DRIVELINE Transmission & DRIVELINE Transmission brakes are prohibited. Automatics functional neutral safety switch is mandatory, and all transmission lines must be metallic or high-pressure type hose. Manuals all transmissions must be clutch assisted, sequential shifters are prohibited. Swaps between manufacturers are not permitted. Ford must have Ford engine, Chevrolet/GMC must have GM engine, etc. Must use factory engine mounts, engine must be in factory OEM location. Must be an OEM available engine, no major modifications to engine. No aluminum engine blocks are permitted unless OME. Any conventional type heads allowed, no billet or pro-stock heads. No power adders unless OEM factory.

Single four-barrel carburetor or factory fuel injection only.

OEM style intake manifolds only, aluminum is permitted. No tunnel rams, split manifolds, or sheet metal intakes permitted.

No superchargers or turbochargers permitted unless OEM equipped from the factory. Air cleaners are required and must be in place. No headlights may be removed for air intakes.

Must have a factory type exhaust system with working mufflers - no open headers permitted.

All cooling for the truck must be in the factory locations. i.e., transmission coolers, radiators, etc. Radiator must be of factory size and in OEM location and circulate coolant freely.

### OPEN STREET GAS 4x4 TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 8. FUEL Gasoline is the only fuel permitted. Absolutely no alcohol, injectables, nitrous oxide or other oxygen extenders. Turbo-Blue and Cam-2 are permitted. Fuel cells may be utilized also as long as they are not located in the driver's compartment.
- 9. HITCH A rear bumper or "Reese" style hitch is the only acceptable type of hitch. No other types of hitches are permitted. Maximum hitch height of 26 inches for a four-wheel-drive truck and 30 inches for a two-wheel-drive truck. Hook point must be past the bed of the truck if there is no bumper, or past the end of the bumper. Reese hitch must be attached to the frame within eight (8) inches of the end of the frame rails. Hitch reinforcements must not extend beyond the centerline of the rear axle. Shortening of the bed in order to shorten the hook point is not permitted. Each driver must supply a twisted clevis, the hole for hitching must accommodate a minimum of 3.75 inches across. Any driver that comes to the sled without a proper hitch may drop to last in the class and will forfeit one attempt. Excessive delay of the event waiting for a proper hitch will be grounds for disqualification and will forfeit hook fee.

### 10. LEGAL HITCH SETUP

Maximum hitch height of 26"-4wd, or 30"-2wd. To be measured at the point of hook. Opening minimum of 3 inches wide (side to side) and 3.75" inches long (front to back) If you back your truck to a wall the hitch would hit first.

- 11. INTERIOR A complete interior, including dashboard, door panels, headliner, etc., is mandatory. Two matching front seats are mandatory. Aftermarket seats are permitted; they must be fully upholstered. All factory controls (lights, signals, horn, windows, wipers, etc.) must be retained and be operative. The use of hand-throttle controls is prohibited.
- 12. SAFETY All drivers must wear a minimum of shirt, long pants, and closed toed shoes during competition. Driver's window must be completely rolled up while competing. Drivers must wear a seatbelt or shoulder harness when hooked to the sled. Passengers are not permitted at any time either in the pits or on the track.
- 13. STEERING The vehicle must retain the full, original OEM steering gear and OEM power steering assistance, if it was so equipped. Additional stabilizers are permitted. Non-OEM power assist methods are prohibited.
- 14. STREET EQUIPMENT Complete headlight and taillight assemblies (all) are mandatory and must be operative. Complete OEM windshield and windows are mandatory. Windows must be operative per factory specifications; that is, they must open and close via OEM electrical or mechanical means.
- 15. SUSPENSION-FRONT The upper mounting point for strut assemblies must be in the factory location. The lower control arm must attach the chassis using OEM mounting points. The lower mounting point for the strut assembly may be modified for improved caster or camber.
- 16. SUSPENSION-REAR An OEM-style suspension is mandatory; leaf spring packs must retain a minimum of three (3) leafs. Traction bars and devices are permitted; they must be bolt-on only; welds are permitted for attachment to frame or axle housing. All OEM suspension mounting points must be retained and used. The rear suspension must maintain a minimum compression shock travel of two inches; compression stops must be adjustable. All rear suspensions must use at least one working shock absorber per wheel. Airbag spring assistance is permitted; airbag compressors must be disconnected.

### OPEN STREET GAS 4x4 TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 17. TIRES/WHEELS DOT street legal tires are required. No dual wheels, studded tires, tire chains or any tire not specifically intended for street use are permitted. All tires must carry a DOT number on the side wall, DOT number must be easily read from the outside of the tire. No cut, altered, or sharpened tires. Wheels must have DOT stamp. No "Real" or other types of wheels. Must maintain OEM Stagger. Use of dirt deflectors is prohibited. Maximum tire size of 35x12.50. (Metric conversion of this tire size is 315/70 or 315/75)
- 18. WEIGHT Weight class is 6,800 lbs., weight may be adjusted by officials No weight brackets or hanging weights allowed in front of vehicles. Weights must be in the bed of the truck only and securely fastened or contained safely therein. No weights permitted inside the cab. No weights allowed under hood or in the wheel wells. No weights may be suspended under the body/chassis or behind panels/parts.

### OPEN STREET DIESEL 4x4 TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. Maximum weight of 8,500 lbs.
- BATTERIES Batteries must remain inside the engine compartment and must be securely fastened. No batteries allowed inside the cab or forward of the radiator core support.
- 3. BRAKES Four-wheel hydraulic brakes are mandatory.
- 4. BODY The body must be an OEM truck body, the complete OEM floor pan and complete OEM firewall is mandatory. All body panels including in the inner and outer skins of the truck bed as well as the bed floor must be O.E.M. Manufactured flatbeds are permitted, no homemade beds.
  - Metal aftermarket hoods are permitted; fiberglass hoods are not permitted. Hood must be closed and securely latched during competition.
  - Front bumpers must be factory stock. No weighted front devices are permitted, this includes but is not limited to homemade bumpers, brush guards, "Ranch Hand" type bumpers, and winches. Lower brackets (only) for snowplow frames are permitted so long as no modifications that would add weight are determined. An unaltered decorative brush guard may be permitted at the option of the head official. A truck is permitted to compete without a front bumper.
- 5. CHASSIS The vehicle must retain the full OEM chassis, one-ton or smaller. No tube or homemade frames/chassis permitted. The wheelbase may not be changed from the original manufacturer. Front and rear wheels must be centered in the wheel wells of the body. The engine must be in the OEM location for the body used. Wheel tubs, back-half conversions, tube chassis, etc., are prohibited. Maximum width of 102 inches.
- 6. CREDENTIALS All drivers must have a valid driver's license. Vehicle owners are required to maintain a valid vehicle registration and have the registration card in their possession. Trucks are permitted to be hauled in for competition.
- 7. DRIVELINE Transmission, transfer case, front and rear axles must be O.E.M. and available in one-ton (or smaller) trucks.

### OPEN STREET DIESEL 4x4 TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

8. ENGINE - The engine must be a stock-appearing compression ignition engine from a one-ton or smaller pickup truck. Swaps between manufacturers are not permitted. Ford must have a Powerstroke engine, Dodge must have a Cummins engine, Chevrolet/GMC must have a Duramax engine, etc.

Must use factory engine mounts, engine must be in factory OEM location. No aftermarket cylinder heads. (Hamilton, Wagler, homemade billet, etc.) Intake manifolds must be OEM style, no side draft or runner style manifolds permitted. Fuel injection pump limited to stock appearing, OEM engine model-specific pumps. Dual high pressure common rail pumps are permitted, pumps from different years in the same engine model may be interchanged. (i.e., P-pump 24 valve Cummins is legal, a P-pump 7.3 Powerstroke is not legal)

Exhaust must exit behind the cab. Stacks exiting through the hood or fender well are prohibited.

All cooling for the truck must be located in the factory locations. i.e., transmission coolers, radiators, etc. Radiator must be of factory size and in OEM location and circulate coolant freely.

All engines turning 4500 RPM and higher must be equipped with a harmonic balancer or damper meeting SFI Spec 18.1.

Water injection is prohibited. All system components must be removed from the truck. All Air Intake must be in the engine compartment-No Intake in Non-OEM grill holes, headlights etc. All Headlights must be in OEM location and functional.

- 9. FUEL The fuel must be pump #1/#2 diesel only. Soy/Biodiesel fuel is permitted. NITROUS OXIDE is prohibited along with other oxygen extenders as well as the use of PROPANE is also prohibited. All system components MUST be removed from the truck. Fuel tanks must be OEM and in the factory location. Fuel cells are permitted as long as they are not located in
  - the driver's compartment.

    O. HITCH A rear bumper or "Reese" style hitch is the only acceptable type of hitch. No other types of hitches are permitted. Maximum hitch height of 26 inches for a four -wheel-drive truck and 30 inches for a two-wheel-drive trucks. Hook point must be past the bed of the truck if there is no bumper, or past the end of the bumper. Reese
    - hitch must be attached to the frame within eight (8) inches of the end of the frame rails. Hitch reinforcements must not extend forward of the centerline of the rear axle. Shortening of the bed in order to shorten the hook point is not permitted. Each driver must supply a twisted clevis, the hole for hitching must accommodate a minimum of 3.75 inches across. Any driver that comes to the sled without a proper hitch may drop to last in the class but will forfeit one attempt. Excessive delay of the event waiting for a proper hitch will be grounds for disqualification
- 11. Maximum hitch height of 26"-4wd, or 30"-2wd. To be measured at the point of hook. Opening minimum of 3 inches wide (side to side) and 3.75" inches long (front to back)
  - If you back your truck to a wall the hitch would hit first.

and will forfeit hook fee.

12. INTERIOR - A complete interior, including dashboard, door panels, headliner, etc., is mandatory. Two matching front seats are mandatory. Aftermarket seats are permitted; they must be fully upholstered. All factory controls (lights, signals, horn, windows, wipers, etc.) must be retained and be operative. The use of hand-throttle controls are prohibited.

### OPEN STREET DIESEL 4x4 TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 13. SAFETY All drivers must wear a minimum of shirt, long pants, and closed toed shoes during competition. Driver's window must be completely rolled up while competing. Drivers must wear a seatbelt or shoulder harness when hooked to the sled. Passengers are not permitted at any time either in the pits or on the track.
- 14. STEERING The vehicle must retain the full, original OEM steering gear and OEM power steering assistance, if it was so equipped. Additional stabilizers are permitted. Non-OEM power assist methods are prohibited.
- 15. STREET EQUIPMENT Complete headlight and tail-light assemblies (all) are mandatory and must be in place and operative. Complete OEM windshield and windows are mandatory. Windows must be operative per factory specifications; that is, they must open and close via OEM electrical or mechanical means.
- 16. SUSPENSION-FRONT The upper mounting point for strut assemblies must be in the factory location. The lower control arm must attach the chassis using OEM mounting points. The lower mounting point for the strut assembly may be modified for improved caster or camber.
- 17. SUSPENSION-REAR An OEM-style suspension is mandatory; leaf spring packs must retain a minimum of three (3) leafs. Traction bars and devices are permitted; they must be bolt-on only; welds are permitted for attachment to frame or axle housing. All OEM suspension mounting points must be retained and used. The rear suspension must maintain a minimum compression shock travel of two inches; compression stops must be adjustable. All rear suspensions must use at least one working shock absorber per wheel. Airbag spring assistance is permitted; airbag compressors must be disconnected.
- 18. TIRES/WHEELS DOT street legal tires are required. No studded tires, tire chains or any tire not specifically intended for street use are permitted. All tires must carry a DOT. number on the side wall, DOT number must be easily read from the outside of the tire. No cut, altered, or sharpened tires. Dual Wheels are permitted only on trucks with a specific OEM bed designed for this application. Maximum tire per side width for dual wheels is 18" total. Wheels must have DOT stamp. No "Real" or other types of wheels. Must maintain OEM Stagger. Use of dirt deflectors is prohibited. Maximum tire size of 35x12.50. (Metric conversion of this tire size is 315/70 or 315/75)
- 19. TRANSMISSION-AUTOMATIC Non-OEM transmissions are prohibited. Transmission brakes are prohibited. Any non-OEM floor-mounted automatic transmission shifter must be equipped with a spring-loaded positive reverse lockout device to prevent the shifter from accidentally being put into reverse gear. A functional neutral safety switch is mandatory. All transmission lines must be metallic or high-pressure-type hose.
- 20. TRANSMISSION-MANUAL Non-OEM transmissions are prohibited. All manual transmissions must be clutch assisted, sequential shifters are prohibited. All vehicles with engines running 4500 rpm or more must be equipped with a USA-EAST approved clutch and flywheel shield (or blanket).
- 21. WEIGHT Maximum weight of 8,500 lbs. No weight brackets or hanging weights allowed in front of vehicles. Weights must be in the bed of the truck only and securely fastened or contained safely therein. No weights permitted inside the cab. No weights allowed under hood or in the wheel wells. No weights may be suspended under the body/chassis or behind panels/parts.

### OPEN STREET DIESEL 4x4 TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

22. TURBOCHARGER - Limited to a single turbocharger with a single compression stage is permitted. Maximum of 2.550" inlet, MAP width enhancement is allowed. Maximum MAP width .200". The MWE groove must be inside the neck area where intake is measured at 2.550". Compressor wheel must protrude into the 2.550" inch bore. Intake housing to be no larger than 2.550" at the face of the wheel. OR

Limited to a single 2.6" inducer bore turbocharger, bore must be smooth-faced (no MAP/MWE ring/groove) with all air entering through the 2.6" opening. Bore will be checked with a 2.605" plug, plug must not be able to enter the inducer bore and contact the compressor wheel. Compressor wheel must protrude 1/8 inch inside of the opening.

6.4-liter Powerstroke engines may utilize the factory twin-turbo configuration. 6.4 Powerstroke will be permitted to run modified turbos, as long as the atmosphere turbo does not exceed the OEM straight bore dimension. (2.59") No TAPERED COVERS will be permitted.

Competitors must make provisions at tech officials' request to allow complete inspection of the compressor wheel and housing. Failure to comply with the request will result in disqualification and banishment until the turbo is re-inspected.

### HIGH OUTPUT BIG BLOCK 4x4 TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. High Output Gas Big Block Maximum weight is set at 6,200 pounds.
- 2. Additional added weight is permitted.
- 3. Hanging weights and brackets may not extend more than 195 inches from the centerline of the rear axle. Weights may not extend more than 60" from the centerline of the front axle.
- 4. Weights may be securely fastened inside the engine compartment, or in the bed, but not inside the cab.
- 5. Weights may be securely fastened inside the engine compartment, or in the bed, but not inside the cab.
- 6. Truck exterior must be stock in appearance. Full fiberglass bodies are not permitted. OEM cab must have OEM firewall and OEM floor for safety. Bed floor is not required however there must be a tonneau cover.
- Any single, four-barrel carburetor permitted. No dual carburetors permitted. NO Tunnel Rams or Sheet Metal intakes are permitted.
- 8. Rear of the engine block must remain at least 12" behind the centerline of the front axle.
- 9. Open headers allowed. All vehicles must have upward-pointing exhaust of the truck hood or under the fender-downward. Exhaust may be routed vertically up through the vehicle hood. The exhaust must be minimum 6" higher than the hood when the hood is in the closed position.
- 10. No cubic inch limit is imposed.
- 11. Aluminum cylinder heads are allowed without restriction.
- Suspension may be either blocked or solid, with no hydraulic suspension or air bags permitted. Traction control devices are NOT permitted. Front working brakes are required.

### HIGH OUTPUT BIG BLOCK 4x4 TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 13. Suspension must have a minimum of 2" of travel.
- Drivetrain size must not exceed 1 ton. Only OEM frame rails are permitted. Wheelbase may not exceed 136".
- 15. Transfer cases must be 1 ton or less. No drop boxes are permitted.
- Gasoline, E-85 (ethanol), alcohol, and racing fuel are permitted. Nitrous oxide and all
  other oxygen extenders are PROHIBITED. Fuel tanks may be mounted on the front of
  the weight box.
- 17. All tires must be DOT approved, maximum size of 35x12.50. (Metric conversion of this tire size is 315/70 or 315/75). No cut, altered, or sharpened tires are permitted. No duals allowed. Use of dirt deflectors is prohibited.
- 18. Maximum hitch height of 26 inches. The opening in the hitch must be 3.75" x 3.0". The length of the hitch measured from the center of the rear axle to the hitch point may be no shorter than 27% of the actual wheelbase of the truck. No part of the hitch can extend more than 3" above the frame rail or further forward than the centerline of the rear axle.
- 19. Trucks in this class do not have to be licensed or inspected or insured. If not street legal, must have all safety equipment in place. Any street licensed truck that chooses to enter this class. Must be fully licensed and insured.
- 20. All drivers must wear a minimum of shirt, long pants, and closed toed shoes during competition. Driver's window must be completely rolled up while competing. Drivers must wear a seatbelt or shoulder harness when hooked to the sled. Passengers are not permitted at any time either in the pits or on the track

### Run What Ya Brung TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. Open to any two- or four- wheel drive truck you brung.
- 2. Maximum weight of all 4x4 will be 7,500 lbs. Limited Pro Diesel (3.0) trucks will be allowed to compete in the RWYB class at a maximum weight of 8,000 lbs. if they comply with all current rules in place for their respective class. If the turbo, tires, etc. are changed from current 3.0 rules, maximum weight is limited to 7,500 lbs. as all other 4x4 trucks. 3.0 trucks will only be allowed to compete in one class per event if both RWYB & 3.0 classes are offered.
- 3. Four-Wheel-Drive Trucks Maximum weight of all 4x4 will be 7,500 lbs. Limited Pro Diesel (3.0) trucks will be allowed to compete in the RWYB class at a maximum weight of 8,000 lbs. if they comply with all current rules in place for there respective class. If the turbo, tires, etc. are changed from current 3.0 rules, maximum weight is limited to 7,500 lbs. as all other 4x4 trucks. 3.0 trucks will only be allowed to compete in one class per event if both RWYB & amp; 3.0 classes are offered.
- 4. Maximum drawbar height for all 4x4 trucks will be 26", with the following exceptions; naturally aspirated trucks will be 28" hitch. Naturally aspirated with nitrous will be 27".
- 5. Drawbars: Diesel Super Stock Trucks, Lim Pro 3.0 Trucks, Nitrous Engine Trucks 134"-158" wheelbase Hook point must be no closer than 44" of center line of rear axle, hitch height maximum of 26", with a minimum of a 3.75" X 3.0" opening. Hitch point must be easily accessed. No "trick" type hitches permitted. Hitch must be stationary in all directions. Hitch must be frame mounted. Hitch must be mounted center line of rear axle or behind. Hitch must not exceed a maximum of 33° angle from pivot point to hook point. No hitch supports or adjusters, fastened to the rear axle housing shall be above the center line of rear axle. Pivot pin of drawbar can be no further forward than centerline of the rear axle.

### Run What Ya Brung TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 6. Drawbars: Naturally Aspirated or Blown Alcohol Engine Trucks with 133" Wheelbase or smaller hook point must be no closer than 30% of the actual wheelbase of the truck (133" wheelbase is 39.9" hitch length) Hitch height maximum of 26" (with above exceptions), with a minimum of a 3.75" X 3.0" opening. No "trick" type hitches permitted. Hitch must be stationary in all directions. Hitch must be frame mounted. Hitch must be mounted center line of rear axle or behind. Hitch must not exceed a maximum of 33° angle from pivot point to hook point. No hitch supports or adjusters, fastened to the rear axle housing shall be above the center line of rear axle. Pivot pin of drawbar can be no further forward than centerline of the rear axle.
- 7. Driveline: Aftermarket transfer cases are permitted. Planetary axles are permitted. Axle shields are required and will be .060" thickness in steel or aluminum. Shield shall not be mounted to axle ends or hub bolts. An access hole may be left open to allow locking in the hubs.
- 8. Engines: All engines must be behind the grill. Gasoline or alcohol engines, rear of engine block can be no further forward than the center line of the front axle. Diesel engines, front of engine block can be no further forward than 25" of center line of front axle.
- 9. Gasoline or Alcohol Engines: may utilize a single supercharger or a single turbocharger. All shields and restraints on the supercharger must be in place. Maximum supercharger size:14-71, 19-inch rotor length. For vehicles utilizing an 8-71 blower the following dimensions:16-inch rotor case length. Screw-type superchargers are not permitted. Variable multi-speed supercharger devices prohibited. Pro-Chargers are allowed a maximum size of F-3R-130. Fuel injection is permitted. A single turbocharger is also permitted in this configuration. Supercharged or single stage turbocharged engines are limited to 575 cubic inches. Nitrous Oxide is permitted for use on any naturally aspirated gasoline engine. This may not be used with alcohol or with any turbocharged or supercharged engine. Other fuels and additives. Propane/NOS, etc. is prohibited on all engines except naturally aspirated gasoline engines. System components used for these banned substances must be fully removed from the truck. Other oxygen extenders are prohibited such as propylene oxide additives. Racing fuel is permitted.
- 10. Diesel Engines: are restricted to 6 cylinder and 8-cylinder compression ignition engines. Class maximum of 460 cubic inches will be enforced. Diesel engines must have been available in a one-ton or less truck from the factory. Sigma fuel pumps are permitted. Water injection is permitted. The fuel must be pump #1/#2 diesel only. Soy or Biodiesel fuel is permitted. Diesel engines may use an unlimited size turbo charger. International DT466 blocks or their replacements will be limited to 2 turbo chargers and 2 Pressure stages. Maximum of 460 Cubic Inches.
- 11. Exhaust: The exhaust on a GASOLINE or ALCOHOL vehicle may exit downward at the back of the truck or directly out the back of the truck or straight up through the hood of the truck or straight up at the back of the cab. All DIESEL vehicles must be equipped to direct exhaust upward.
- 12. Firewall: Each vehicle must be equipped with an OEM or minimum 0.024-inch steel firewall, OR 1/4" Lexan from side to side of the body and from the top of the engine compartments upper seal (hood, cowl, or deck) to the bottom of the floor and/or belly pan. The firewall must provide a bulkhead between the engine and/or fuel tank and driver compartment. All openings must be sealed with metal-excluding grommets. The use of magnesium is prohibited.

### Run What Ya Brung TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 13. Each vehicle in competition must be equipped with an OEM floor pan or a minimum 0.024-inch steel floor pan that extends the full length and width of the driver seating area. Non-OEM floor pans must have cross members (minimum two inch by two-inch, 0.083-inch wall thickness square tubing) installed between the frame rails for proper seat and driver restraint system installation and support. All openings must be sealed with metal-excluding grommets. The use of fiber glass and/or magnesium is prohibited.
- 14. Tires: Four-wheel drive; Bar tires, maximum of four (4) tires, no duals, no combination of bar tires & DOT tires. DOT tires, maximum tire height 36", no studded tires or chains. Dual rear wheels are permitted on the rear axle only. Maximum of 6 tires.
- 15. Tires: Two-wheel drive; Bar tires, maximum tire size is 18.4 x 16.1. DOT tires, maximum tire height 36", no studded tires or chains. Dual rear wheels are permitted. Ribbed tractor-type tires are permitted on the front.
- 16. Aftermarket transmissions are permitted. All manual transmissions must be clutch assisted, sequential shifters are prohibited.
- 17. Front weights may not extend more than 60 inches from the centerline of the front axle. No loose weights allowed in the cab or under the hood allowed. Front weight boxes will be rigid & pamp; have a minimum of eight (8) inches of ground clearance for staging & pamp; competition. Front tow hitch will be strong enough to push, pull or pick the vehicle up. Only a 6x6 piece of steel with a minimum thickness or 1" and a maximum of 1.25" thickness will be allowed. A round three (3) inch hole is required in front tow hitch
- 18. The maximum wheelbase length allowed is 158 inches. The maximum wheelbase variation from left to right is one inch; the measurement will be made using an X pattern (LF-RR and RF-LR). The maximum tread width is 102 inches. Extending rear wheels beyond the OEM position is permitted.

### 19. GENERAL

Clear plexiglass or factory tint glass permitted. No mud flaps or dirt deflectors will be permitted.

No fuel tanks, fuel lines, pressure gauges or pumps allowed in cabs. All hydraulic lines in the cab must be shielded top and sides with a minimum of .060 aluminum. All air or hydraulic suspension systems cannot have hydraulic, air, or electric lines attached to these devices during competition. No digital, microprocessor, computer, or programmable ignition controls. No traction control ignition accessories. No six shooter, power grid systems or similar type ignition controls. (Starter saver allowed) All drivers must wear a minimum of shirt, long pants, and closed toed shoes during competition. Driver's window must be completely rolled up while competing. Drivers must wear a seatbelt or shoulder harness when hooked to the sled. Passengers are not permitted at any time either in the pits or on the track.

### TRI-AXELS & SEMIS TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. All rules apply to all trucks in all classes.
- 2. All classes will require a minimum of 5 pullers to receive purse payout.
- 3. If minimum trucks are not met for a class: First, \$120 Second, \$100 Third, \$80 Fourth, \$60 Fifth, \$50
- All trucks must pass a safety and tech inspection. A 2-1/2 lb. Fire extinguisher required.
- Truck must have affixed a current license plate of the state of registration and the owner/driver must furnish the current registration card and insurance card for the truck. The driver must have a current CDL license. These will all be required at the tech site.
- 6. Truck and engine must be factory stock.
- 7. The promoter of the event will provide the hitching device. This hitch will work from the fifth wheel only for Semis and from hooks (each side) for Tri-axles. Hitches will be placed in position and checked by officials just prior to the truck entering the track to pull. IT SHALL BE THE OWNER/DRIVER'S RESPONSIBILITY TO LOCK THE FIFTH WHEEL HITCH IN PLACE.
- 8. The truck shall appear 'road ready'. No added weight or ballast is permitted. Any added weight will disqualify the truck from the pull. Special trucks, such as oil field trucks that carry additional weight that is not normally found on a 'road ready' truck are not permitted in any class.
- 9. Chaining or blocking of drive axles is NOT permitted.
- 10. A single turbo-charger is the maximum permitted, unless factory installed.
- 11. No ether, alcohol, water, nitrous, propane or other liquid or combustible material may be injected into the turbo-charger or any part of the air intake system. Any ether kit must be disconnected.

### TRI-AXELS & SEMIS TRUCK PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 12. No riders are permitted in the truck. No riders during pull.
- 13. Driver must wear their seatbelt during the pull.
- 14. Driver may not leave the driver's seat while vehicle is on the pulling track.
- 15. Driver will take all direction from the flagman on the track.
- Truck must start with a tight hitch, no jerking or working of clutch after pull is started. Any violation will be disqualified.
- Truck and sled must remain in boundaries during pull. Any attempt to move sled is considered measurable.
- 18. Each puller may use the 75' mark on the first attempt failure to reach that point shall entitle the puller to an immediate re-hook.
- 19. If all other weight transfer techniques fail to produce a winner in the pull-off, the chain may be lengthened by the event officials.

- 3. All tractors must have stock appearing hood, grill, frame, and fenders in place.
- 4. Factory Wheelbase must be retained.
- All tractors must have fenders.
- 6. Hydraulic System and PTO are not Required.
- 7. Must burn fuel as factory equipped. No fuel oxidizer allowed (i.e., Nitrous Oxide)

### LIGHT TOUGH FARM TRACTOR PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 8. All tractors must be equipped with both rear brakes working.
- 9. Use of torque converters, automatic shift, etc. is permitted.
- 10. No foot cross over and no hand control of foot brakes permitted.
- 11. No industrial tractor.
- 12. No slipper clutches allowed.
- 13. Length from center of rear axle to the farthest point forward on the tractor (including weights) not to exceed 12 ft.
- 14. Tires- Contest is open to farm tractors with rubber tires. No cut tires, no tire studs, or chains permitted. Four -wheel drive tractors are permitted if front wheels are disengaged. No dual wheels. Factory wheels configuration. Maximum tire size of 18.4x38.
- 15. Engine: 3000 rpm limit on all tractors.

Heads must be OEM cast iron heads, no Aluminum heads permitted.

Diesel (turbocharged) 360 cubic inch limit.

Engine must be stock agricultural block or factory replacement. No visual modifications (i.e., intake manifolds, water injection, or modified injection lines, etc.) Must have factory intakes and exhaust manifolds.

Cummins engine can be installed as a replacement engine provided factory bell housing is in place, must be 12 value head Turbocharger.

Gasoline (Naturally aspirated).

Engine must be stock agricultural block or factory replacement. No displacement limit for naturally aspirated engines. No V-8 engines, single up-draft carburetor. Gas engines with 360 ci or less can be turbocharged.

- 16. Turbochargers: The compressor housing will have a maximum of 2.3" inside diameter (I.D) of intake and 2.0" outside diameter outlet. The exhaust housing will have a maximum outlet of 2.8" i.e.,. A stock map width enhancement (MWE) groove is allowed, Maximum size is 0.180". Diesel Injection Pump; Mechanical rotary style pump. P-pumps or A-Pumps not permitted unless installed by the factory in the tractor and engine in question. Contestant must provide factory documentation to officials on tractor entered to obtain approval.
- 17. Safety Equipment Required: Wheelie bars must be capable of supporting tractor when the tractor is weighted to 8000#. Wheelie bars must be independent of the pulling hitch. Air shut off device on intake of diesel engines, connected to the pulling sled. Ignition kill switch on spark ignited engines, connected to the pulling sled. Clutch safety blankets, Roll over protection. (ROPS) All tractor's flywheels to be steel construction, tractor owner will be required to sign a document that stated a steel flywheel is installed. All competitors must wear a DOT approved helmet. Engine shields are required, including fans and turbochargers.
- 18. Drawbar: Minimum drawbar length is 18" from the center of rear axle to point of hook up. Drawbar must be stationary in all directions.

Maximum height is 20" from top of hitching device parallel to the ground. Any vertical clevis will be measured to center of loop.

Hitch hole must be at least 3 1/2" diameter and have at least 1" cross section at the hook point.

No bracing above center of rear axle except for complete factory set-up. If above center it must be cradled.

### LIGHT TOUGH FARM TRACTOR PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

19. Weight: All weights must be secured to the tractor.

No weight may extend more than 13 ft forward from the center of rear axle.

No weights permitted on seat or deck.

No weights to extend past the rear of the rear tire.

Any weights or external parts lost while hooked to the sled will be cause for disqualification of the pull. No refunds will be given.

### HEAVY TOUGH FARM TRACTOR PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- All Heavy Tough Farm Tractors must be stock appearing. Hoods, grill, fenders and frame must be stock appearing for make and model being pulled. Tractor must have a stock block or its replacement. No component tractors will be permitted in the class.
- 2. Weigh Class: 11,500lb.
- No weight may extend more than 24" beyond the forward most point of the hood or front tires.
- 4. Rear weights may not extend more than 6" past rear tires, and may not interfere with hooking device or ability to hook and unhook the tractor from the sled.
- 5. No weights permitted on seat or deck.
- 6. Any part falling off tractor while under the green flag will be disqualified. All weight must be securely fastened. Tarp straps are not allowed anywhere on the tractor.
- 7. RPM Limit: 3,000 RPM limit on all tractors. Tractors competing may be tested prior to hooking. Tractors may also be subject to testing during competition and also at the end of the track. Tech officials will have the option to operate the throttle. Refusal by tractor operator will result in disqualification. No refunds will be given.
- 8. ENGINE: Must be OEM block or its replacement, no visual modifications to block. Must have OEM stock head (no recast blocks or heads, no aluminum heads, no deck plates/girdles, no hard blocking, no intake spacers). Use of torque converters, automatic shift, etc. is permitted. CUBIC INCH: Maximum 504 cubic inch, unless factory cubes are larger and must be factory cubic inch.
- 9. FUEL PUMP: Stock appearing OEM style pumps required (No P Pumps). Legality of the injector pump by officials is based on the visual inspection of the outside housing and not the inner workings of the injector pump. All fuel injection pumps must maintain stock OEM Dimensions. No Billet Pumps, no sigma pumps OR MW or Re-Cast pumps are permitted. Supply pumps are permitted.
- THROTTLE: Tractors must be equipped with stock throttle spring loaded throttle.
   Dead man throttle recommended.

TURBOCHARGER: Tractor is limited to a single turbo charger the inducer bore on the compressor housing may be 2.6". The inlet will be measured using a 2.65-inch plug or Internal calipers. Measurement point will be at the actual turbo housing inlet. A stock map width enhancement (MWE) groove is allowed. Turbo is limited to an out of the box Borg Warner S366 at this time with no modifications or machining to the housing to allow a larger wheel. No clipped wheels or altered wheels allowed. Lesser turbos are allowed upon inspection or by tech officials prior to pulling. OEM stock intake and exhaust manifolds must be used for that series engine (alterations for turbo mounting ONLY are allowed).

Compressor wheel must protrude into 2.6" bore.

Stock map width enhancement up to .145" permitted. Must be In OEM location. All Air flow must go through the turbo intake and map ring, no other air flow will be permitted: For example, drilled holes around the turbo intake are not allowed.

### HEAVY TOUGH FARM TRACTOR PULL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 11. WATER: Water injection is allowed. No intercoolers. No types of accelerants or oxygen extenders or the like will be permitted. Competitor may be required to drain water and refill with new water approved by tech officials.
- 12. EXHAUST: MUST discharge vertically. MUST have two (2) Grade 5 cross bolts (3/8"} in the exhaust elbow or pipe. Bolts must be installed 90 degrees to each other and within one (1) inch of each other as close to turbo as possible.
- 13. FUEL: Fuel must be OEM equipped and intended whether diesel or gas. No oxygen or other accelerants such as methanol, cetane, propane, or any other that may be considered an accelerant. FUEL TANKS: No pressurized fuel tanks.
- SHEET METAL: Must have original hood, grill, and sheet metal. Rear fenders are required.
- 15. DRAWBAR: Must be equipped with steel hitching device with thickness no less than 1" square or 1-1/8" round stock and no more than 1-1/2" thick square or round stock. A 3-1/2" diameter hole is required. A cross -sectional thickness of 1" square minimum must be maintained at any given point of hitch loop. No bracing above center of axle except for complete factory setup. If above center, it must be cradled. Drawbar length is 18" from the center of rear axle to point of hook up. Drawbar must be stationary in all directions. Maximum height is- 20" from top of hitching device parallel to the ground. Any vertical clevis will be measured to center of loop.
- TIRE: Tire size limited to 20.8 x 38. No cut tires, no tire studs or chains permitted.
   Four -wheel drive tractors are permitted if front wheels are disengaged. No dual
   wheels.
- 17. BRAKES: All tractors must be equipped with both rear brakes working. FRONT END: Tractors must be equipped with wide front end.
- 18. SAFETY EQUIPMENT: All engine fans must be shrouded with factory shroud or 1/16" thick steel shroud. All tractors must have a safety kill switch or an air shutoff Each tractor must have a 2.5 lb. dry chemical fire extinguisher accessible to the driver while operating the tractor. Must have at a minimum of a factory R.O.P.S. system capable of supporting the tractor at its heaviest weight class. All tractors must have wheelie bars that are able to support the weight of the tractor. Side Shields are required. Clutch must be steel, unless there is a safety blanket.
- 19. Driver must wear a motor sport designed helmet. (Snell80 or higher).
- 20. Driver must be a minimum of 18 years of age to pull in this class (or if ages 16 or 17 must present a signed and notarized statement of permission from a parent or legal guardian).
- 21. All drivers must wear leather shoes and long pants.
- 22. No more than one person is permitted on the tractor at any time.
- 23. Driver must remain seated and have at least one hand on the wheel at all times. Driver may not leave the seat of the tractor while it is running.

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

# Ox Hill Community Agricultural Fair Through the Years

#### 1936

After a meeting held at the Ox Hill Schoolhouse, in South Mahoning Township; it was suggested by John Warner, who was the county agent to W. Shields McMillen to have a community fair along with the 4-H roundup to get adults involved. At this meeting the very first officers were elected: President, W. Shields McMillen; Vice President, Clair McMillen; Secretary, D.R. Hill; Treasurer, Ord McMillen. On October 10, 1936 the roundup included the 4-H Pig Feeding Club and 4-H Potato Club; all held inside the schoolhouse, located on the McMillen property off Ox Hill Road. This one-day event awarded ribbon prizes to top finishers.

#### 1945

Ox Hill Community Fair becomes part of the PA State Fair Association as they extend to three days and three nights.

#### 1961

The Ox Hill Fair moves to a four-day and four-night event.

#### 1962

A Beauty Contest emerges, as the first Ox Hill Fair Queen and Princess are crowned.

#### 1969

The 34<sup>th</sup> annual edition of the Ox Hill Community Agricultural Fair is conducted from September 1 through September 6, moving from a 4-day fair to a 6-day fair.

#### 1970

The first Lightweight and Heavyweight Midget Tractor Pull emerges as a new event at the track.

#### 1975

The Keystone Midget Tractor Pulling Association debuts at Ox Hill.

#### 1978

Admission to the fairgrounds remain free, but a charge of \$1.00 was introduced for parking.

#### 1981

A four-wheel-drive truck pulling contest becomes a fair favorite, with the very first truck pulls at Ox Hill Fair.

#### 1989

For the first time at Ox Hill, Mud Wrestling with ladies and men's bouts.
